An **article abstract** is a summary of the full article and explains what the article is about. It offers a quick overview of the article's content and can help you decide if the article will be useful for your research.

When you do not select **Full Text Documents** you may see results that only offer an article abstract without providing access to the complete article

Using **Advanced Search**
enables you to select
required or desired options

Conducting a Thorough Keyword Search

for Literature Reviews

1. Write down 2 or 3 key concepts related to your topic
2. List different words or phrases for each concept
3. Use **advanced search** feature in a database to find related articles
4. Expand your findings by searching for terms in the **full text** of articles

- The 5 W's of Web Site Evaluation

Question? – Think about...

- Who? – recognized author or organization (experts, .gov, .edu, foundations)
 - What? – purpose and content (bias, information verification, complete)
 - When? – currency of info (publication date, last updated)
 - Where? – source of info reported (original study, references provided)
 - Why? – worth using (for your purpose, best of comparable sources)
- *Some web sources may **not** be appropriate to use as a reference, but may serve as overview articles to increase your familiarity with terms to use when searching databases for peer reviewed articles*

Evaluating Information Sources

Use the **RADAR** acronym to help you remember what to consider as you evaluate information sources for quality and usefulness in your work

Rationale

- **Why** was the information published?
 - To report research results, influence decisions, entertain, etc.

Authority

- **Who** is the author and **what** are their credentials?
 - Is the author associated with a reputable organization?

Date

- **When** was the information published?
 - Is currency important for your topic?

Accuracy

- Was information reviewed by editors or subject experts?
 - **Where** was the information published?
 - **Where** did the author get their information from?

Relevance

- **How** is the information relevant to your work?

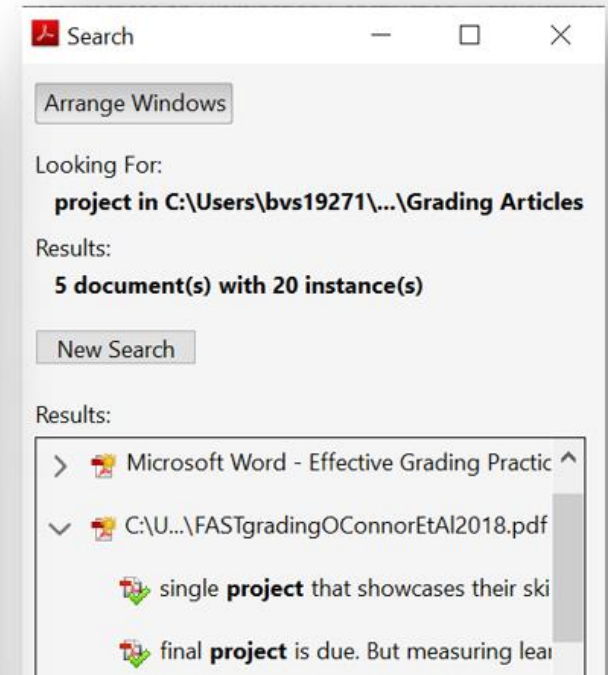
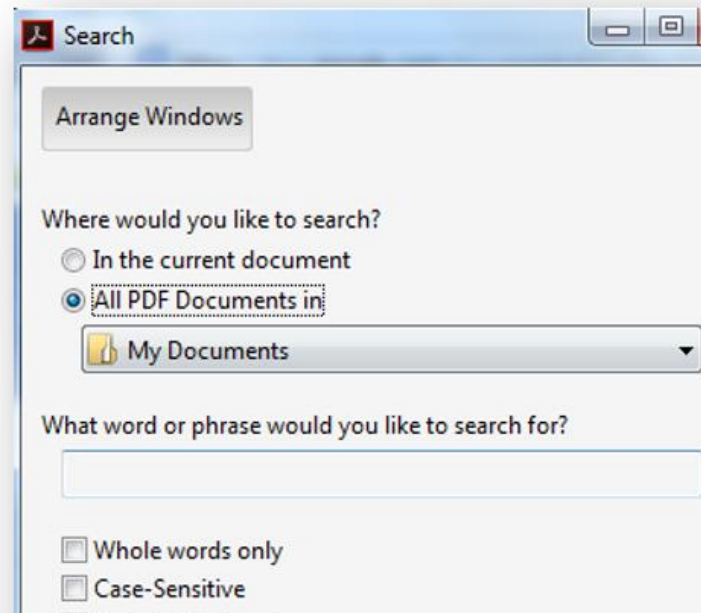
A Tip from Dr. Bryan: Store PDFs in a folder!

Advanced Search in Adobe Reader

To use this process to easily find parts of text that you need to review for your research, store all articles as a PDF in a single folder.

Follow these steps to search for the point in any article in your folder where the word or phrase you search for appears, including comments that you added to the PDF!

- In Adobe Reader **Open a PDF** from your folder of research articles
- **Shift + Ctrl + F** to start advanced search
- Select **All PDF Documents in** and browse for folder with files to be searched
- Use root of a word to find variations (i.e., reflect **finds** reflection, reflective, reflecting...)
- Click the arrowhead beside a file name, then click on a line with your search term(s) in bold to be taken to that part of the article
